RESIDENTIAL WASTE/RECYCLING PROGRAM

To ensure timely and consistent pickup, please have all items curbside by 6:00 am. Residents may place an unlimited amount of *regular* household waste at the curb. All waste must be in size 34 gallon or smaller cans or bags, and must weigh no more than 45 lbs per container. Please clean all recyclable items before placing them curbside. Hazardous waste and yard waste will not be accepted.

The following items are accepted in the recycling program:

PAPER PRODUCTS

- Newspaper with supplements, magazines/catalogs
- Corrugated Cardboard and Chipboard <u>Please cut to 2 feet by 2 feet for collection, and please flatten</u> Brown or gray when torn, including cereal, cracker, and tissue boxes, as well as toilet paper and paper towel cores.
- Mixed paper-white, colored, NCR, FAX, photocopy, legal pad, note, and computer paper
- Post-its, call slips, file folders, envelopes, paper egg cartons, junk mail and paper bags

METALS

• All metal food and beverage containers, aluminum foil and pie plates

PLASTICS

- All plastic containers #1-#7
- Milk, water and juice jugs, detergent, soda bottles and film canisters

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

PAPER

- Food contaminated containers, wax film covered containers
- Hygiene products (toilet paper, paper towels etc.)
- Disposable diapers

METALS

· Large metals, coat hangers, engine parts

PLASTICS

- Plastic bags
- Packaging container inserts, even with numbers. EXAMPLE: cookie trays
- Styrofoam
- Motor oil bottles
- Hangers
- Plastic green house or plant containers
- Deli or grocery food containers; even with a number

HAZARDOUS ITEMS LIST

- BATTERIES
- Engine oil, lubricants, antifreeze, other types of oils and/or filters
- Paint still in liquid form (Please mix with cat litter)
- Needles, syringes, medical waste
- Propane and/or empty propane tanks
- Tires
- Refrigerants
